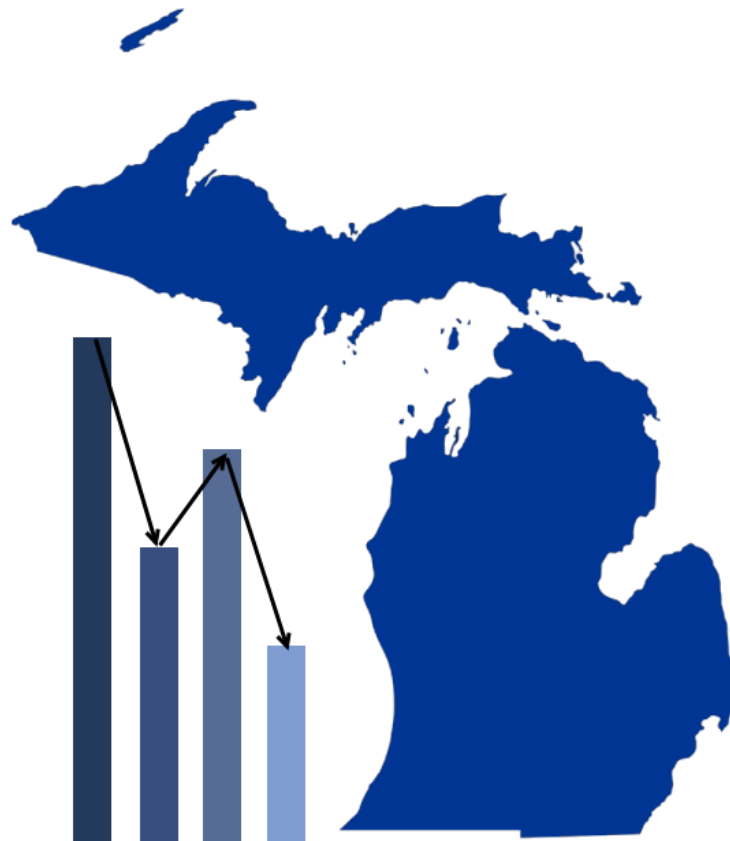

# 2021 Crime in Michigan Annual Report

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## Section 1: The Michigan Incident Crime Reporting Program (MICR)

### Incident Based Reporting – Collection of Data

In 1989, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) implemented the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). The Michigan Incident Crime Reporting (MICR) program is Michigan's version of NIBRS. The MICR system was established and certified by the FBI in 1994. In 2005, it became the only method of collecting crime data from all of Michigan's law enforcement agencies.

Crime data is collected at the local agency level in the form of police reports. A subset of the data collected at the local level is forwarded to the MICR program, in accordance with MICR system specifications, and is used to produce the annual *Crime in Michigan* report. MICR then forwards a subset of the data it collects from local agencies to the FBI's NIBRS database in accordance with NIBRS system specifications. That subset of data is used to produce national annual reports of crime.



### Comparing Local, State and Federal Crime Collections and Statistical Reports

As of 2021, the FBI publishes state and national crime datasets to the Crime Data Explorer (CDE) application. The CDE includes a combination of Summary Reporting System (SRS) and NIBRS data views and downloadable tables.

The SRS data is derived from the legacy summary-based UCR collection, which collected complete data from ten offenses (Part 1 Crimes) and only arrest data for an additional 30 offenses. MICR's incident-based data is converted to summary-based data for inclusion in these views on the CDE.

The NIBRS data is derived from the contemporary incident-based UCR collection, which collects complete data on 23 Group A offense categories made up of 52 specific offenses and collects arrest data on seven additional Group B offenses. Group A is considered a more serious crime while Group B is less serious. MICR collects the same data elements on Group A and Group B; NIBRS only collects arrest data for Group B.

MICR collects complete data on 107 offenses: 67 Group A offenses and 40 Group B offenses. When it submits data to the NIBRS program, MICR rolls up these 67 Group A offenses into the corresponding 52 NIBRS Group A offenses and submits only arrest data for Group B offenses.

To satisfy the requests and needs of the state of Michigan as well as local Michigan communities, and to provide a more complete picture of crime in our state, the MICR program collects more offense file classes and crime data elements than the FBI's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) program. The additional offenses collected by MICR are grouped into broader NIBRS offenses when submitted to the FBI. Because of this, crime counts for Michigan displayed in federal reports may differ from crime counts displayed in our state's *Crime in Michigan* annual report. For example, MICR collects data for Robbery and Carjacking under two distinct offenses; Carjacking is a sub-category of Robbery. NIBRS does not have an offense code dedicated to Carjacking. In instances where both a Robbery and a Carjacking occurred during the same incident, but to separate victims, MICR would collect one offense for Robbery and one offense for Carjacking. When that incident is forwarded to

NIBRS, and because NIBRS does not allow for multiple of the same offense code on the same incident, only the Robbery offense is forwarded. In this instance, MICR would collect and report two offenses while NIBRS would only collect and report one.

As seen on page nine, some Tribal Agencies submit crime data directly to the FBI. While the FBI will include this data in its statewide statistical reports for Michigan, the data is not included in MICR's annual *Crime in Michigan* report.

Technical barriers to submissions, including transition periods for local agencies to move to a new records management system, a failure to update system specifications to meet MICR requirements, and the rejection of incident submissions that did not meet MICR or NIBRS specifications (if not resolved and resubmitted before state or federal data deadlines) are also sources of differences between local, state and federal data publications.

For SRS data views and downloads on the CDE, the FBI uses an estimation process whereby it estimates complete offense counts for agencies it determines did not submit a full year of data. MICR reports only data that was submitted. As of the release of this publication, the FBI does not perform the same estimation for NIBRS data views and downloads on the CDE.

**Crime counts may differ between local, state, and federal data collections for a variety of reasons, including technical barriers with data transfer, crime counting methodology, reporting dates, and collected data elements and offenses. The submission deadline for 2021 crime data to be published/included in the annual report was March 1, 2022.**

As of 2021, the MICR program is utilizing a new FBI data portal to compare its state collection of crime data to the NIBRS collection to better ensure consistency. This new process will allow the state to better align its database with federal crime collections.

### **FBI's Caution in Ranking**

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## Section 1: Counting Crime

### **Count Methodology for this Annual Report**

**Crime counts** are dependent on crime category:

- Crimes Against Persons – based on victim counts using a hierarchy; only the most serious crime per victim is counted when victims are connected to multiple offenses
- Crimes Against Property – based on offense counts, except:
  - Burglary offenses (22001 and 22002) count the number of premises entered for each burglary offense
  - Motor Vehicle Theft (24001) counts the sum of attempted motor vehicle thefts plus the number of vehicles stolen for each completed motor vehicle theft
- Crimes Against Society – based on offense counts
- Crimes Against All Other – based on offense counts

**Victim counts** based on victim counts using a hierarchy; only the most serious crime per victim is counted when victims are connected to multiple offenses.

**Offense counts** reflect the total number of offenses submitted for each offense file class.

**Incident counts** reflect the total number of incidents for each offense file class based on an offense hierarchy; only the most serious offense is counted when the incident has multiple offenses.

### **Examples of Crime Counts**

*Example 1:* An individual is raped and then murdered

- Murder is a higher ranked offense than rape
- The rape is NOT included in total rapes
- One murder is counted

*Example 2:* An individual is raped, robbed, and then murdered

- Murder is a higher ranked offense than rape; rape is not counted
- Robbery (crime against property; hierarchy not used) is counted
- One murder and one robbery are counted

*Example 3:* One individual is raped, and a second individual is assaulted in one incident

- Rape is counted for individual one
- Aggravated assault is counted for individual two
- One rape and one aggravated assault are counted

*Example 4:* Two individuals are victims of larceny in one incident

- One larceny is counted

## Section 1: Notes About the Data and Updates Starting 2021

Each year, MICR data is “frozen” on a specific date to create the annual *Crime in Michigan* report. This publication’s frozen date was March 1, 2022. Any new or updated crime data submitted to the MICR database after the “frozen” date is not included in the report.

In this report, 2021 and 2020 population estimates listed for individual cities and agencies were provided by the FBI. These estimates are used to determine the crime rates listed in this report. The population counts rely on U.S. Census Bureau data to create approximations of the population served within the “jurisdiction” of the primary law enforcement agency of each city. In some cases, the population used to estimate “jurisdiction” may not align precisely with the population living within that city’s geographic boundaries. Because of this, populations and crime rates produced in the Secure Cities Report are meant to provide a general understanding of crime per-capita for each city as well as changes from one year to the next.

Beginning this year, the MICR program is providing updated counts of prior year crimes in tables displaying year comparisons. In previous annual reports, all yearly counts were static snapshots taken directly from prior year annual reports. They did not include updates reflecting new crimes reported, crimes determined to be unfounded or misreported and consequently deleted from the database, crimes with updated offenses, or crimes showing updated arrests since the annual report’s frozen date. In this 2021 *Crime in Michigan* annual report, all prior year crime counts are updated through the frozen date of this report, March 1, 2022. This change offers a more accurate picture of crime reported to law enforcement agencies in the state of Michigan.

### Additional changes to this year’s report:

- Offense 22003 was recategorized from “Crimes against All Other” to “Crimes against Property”
- Offenses 38003 and 53002 were recategorized from “Crimes against All Other” to “Crimes against Society”
- Previous labels displaying “Gender” now display “Sex”
- Supplemental reports referring to city/township codes have an additional tab displaying City/Twp codes that span county boundaries. (Note: Any use of City/Township in this report or the supplemental reports could refer to a City, Township, Village, College Campus, or other Unincorporated area)

Agencies unable to submit complete data by March 1, 2022, will show artificially low crime counts in this report. This may be due to agencies experiencing a disruption in their crime submission process or transition to a new records management system. Users are cautioned against performing trend analysis or ranking agencies/cities, especially for those agencies/cities that indicate a significant increase or decrease in yearly crime counts. When analyzing crime changes, one should consider missing data, population density/composition/stability, urbanization, modes of transportation, economic conditions, cultural characteristics, family cohesiveness, climate, strength and policies of the criminal justice system, and crime reporting practices of the citizenry.

When used properly, the data provided in this report can significantly contribute to management and planning activities at local, state, and federal levels, especially by state officials, law enforcement agencies, the legislature, and nonprofit organizations. 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## Section 1: Public Act 319 of 1968

### UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING SYSTEM, ACT 319 of 1968

AN ACT to provide a uniform crime reporting system; to provide for the submitting of such report to the department of state police; to require submission of the report by certain police agencies; to require the reporting on wanted persons and stolen vehicles; to require the reporting of information regarding certain persons and unidentified bodies of deceased persons; to prescribe certain powers and duties of law enforcement agencies; and to vest the director of the department of state police with certain authority. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968 ;-- Am. 1985, Act 204, Eff. Mar. 1, 1986

#### **28.251 Uniform crime reports; duties of police departments to file, contents.**

Sec. 1. The police department of each city or village, any duly constituted police department of a township, and the sheriff's department of each county, once each month upon a date and form prescribed and furnished by the director of the department of state police, shall forward to the department of state police a crime report. Each reporting department shall report only on cases within its jurisdiction and upon which it is making, or has made, the primary police investigation. The report shall be called the uniform crime report and shall cover crimes reported and otherwise processed during the month preceding the month of the report. It shall contain the number and nature of offenses committed, the disposition of such offenses and such other information as the director of state police shall specify relating to the method, frequency, cause and prevention of crime. Under no circumstances shall the name of any person be reported. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.

#### **28.252 Compilation of monthly uniform crime reports; use.**

Sec. 2. Upon receipt of the monthly uniform crime reports from the reporting agencies, the department of state police shall prepare a statewide compilation of the statistics contained therein and the resulting statistical compilation shall be available to any governmental law enforcement agency in the state, the judiciary committees of the Michigan state senate and the Michigan state house of representatives, and the federal bureau of investigation, upon request. The statistics made available through the uniform crime report shall be used for the purpose of studying the causes, trends and effects of crime in this state and for intelligence upon which to base a more sound program of crime detection and prevention and the apprehension of criminals. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.

#### **28.253 Voluntary crime reports; inclusion in compilation.**

Sec. 3. Any governmental police agency, not falling within the description of those required to submit the monthly uniform crime report set forth in section 1, which desires to submit such a report, shall be furnished with the proper forms by the department of state police. When a report is received by the department of state police from a governmental police agency not required to make such report, the information contained therein shall be included within the monthly compilation provided for in section 2. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.

#### **28.254 Reports of wanted persons and stolen vehicles.**

Sec. 4. The chief of police of each city or village and of each township having a police department, and the sheriff of each county within this state, shall report to the department of state police, in a manner prescribed by the department, all persons wanted by, and all vehicles stolen from, their primary police jurisdictions. The report shall be made as soon as is practical after the investigating department either ascertains that a vehicle is stolen or obtains a warrant for an individual's arrest or determines that they have reasonable grounds to believe that the individual committed a crime. In no case shall this time exceed 12 hours after the reporting agency determines that it has grounds to believe that a vehicle was stolen or that the wanted person should be arrested. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.



### **28.255 Reports of apprehension or recovery.**

Sec. 5. When at any time after making a report required by section 4 it is determined by the reporting agency that a person is no longer wanted because of his apprehension, or any other factor, and when a vehicle reported stolen under section 4 is recovered, the chief of police or sheriff of the reporting agency shall immediately notify the department of state police in a manner prescribed by the department. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.

### **28.256 Inapplicability of act as to traffic misdemeanors.**

Sec. 6. The provisions of this act do not apply to misdemeanor traffic cases or to persons wanted for misdemeanor traffic offenses, or for the violation of any city, village or township ordinance. The provisions of this act shall not be construed to in any way affect existing or future laws and procedures governing the reporting of persons wanted for traffic law violations or for the violation of city, village or township ordinances. **History:** 1968, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 3, 1968.

### **28.257 Domestic violence incidents; report to state police; contents.**

Sec. 7. The chief of police of each city or village, the chief of police of each township having a police department, and the sheriff of each county within this state shall report to the department of state police, in a manner prescribed by the department, the following information related to domestic violence incidents:

(a) The number of assaults reported that involve an adult and a minor and the disposition of those offenses.

(b) The number of assaults reported that involve either 2 male adults or 2 female adults and the disposition of those offenses.

(c) The number of assaults reported that involve 1 male adult and 1 female adult and the disposition of those offenses.

(d) The number of crimes reported that involve an individual and his or her spouse, his or her former spouse, an individual with whom he or she has had a child in common, an individual with whom he or she has or has had a dating relationship, or an individual who resides or has resided in the same household; and the disposition of those offenses. As used in this subdivision, "dating relationship" means that term as defined in section 2950 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950.

(e) Other statistics the director of the department of state police considers necessary to obtain accurate and reliable data on the incidence of domestic violence in this state. **History:** Add. 1978, Act 319, Imd. Eff. July 10, 1978 ;-- Am. [2001, Act 191](#), Eff. Oct. 1, 2002.

### **28.257a Crimes motivated by prejudice or bias; report.**

Sec. 7a. The chief of police of each city or village, the chief of police of each township having a police department, and the sheriff of each county within this state shall report to the department of state police, in a manner prescribed by the department, information specified under section 1 related to crimes motivated by prejudice or bias based upon race, ethnic origin, religion, gender, or sexual orientation. **History:** Add. 1991, Act 172, Eff. Mar. 30, 1992

### **28.258, Sec. 8. DOES NOT APPLY TO UCR.**

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## Section 2: Agency Participation

In 2021, Michigan had 567 active law enforcement agencies in “MICR reporting” status. Of these 567 agencies, 530 submitted full or partial 2021 crime data to the MICR program before March 1, 2022. The remaining 37 agencies did not submit any 2021 crime data to the MICR program. Agencies that report thru another agency are not included in this section. Railroads that do not participate are not included in the non-participating count or overall state agency count.

### Tribal Agencies

Tribal agencies are not required by law to submit their crime data to the MICR program. The five that contributed data to MICR in 2021 are included in the overall state count and full participation count, noted in the prior paragraph. Data submitted directly to the FBI is not included in this annual report. The five tribal agencies that submitted directly to the FBI, and the two that did not submit to either the FBI or the MICR program, are not included in the non-participating count or overall state agency count.

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### Section 3: Michigan Index Crimes and Rates

The FBI, as part of its SRS reporting views, tracks Part 1 Index Violent and Property crimes. Violent Index crimes consist of Murder, Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault. Property Index crimes consist of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Thefts, and Arson. This annual report uses hierarchical counting rules and groups offense file classes into the corresponding Index Crime categories in order to simulate the Index Crime Reports published by the FBI's SRS *Crime in the United States*.

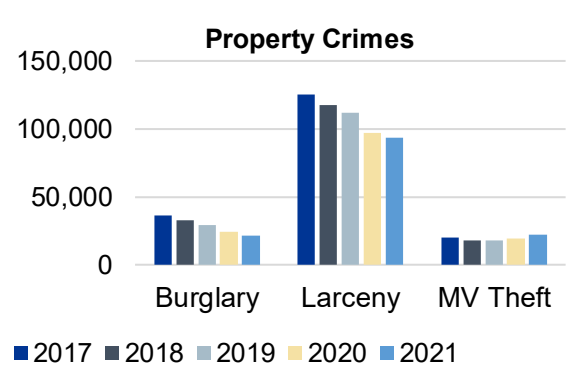
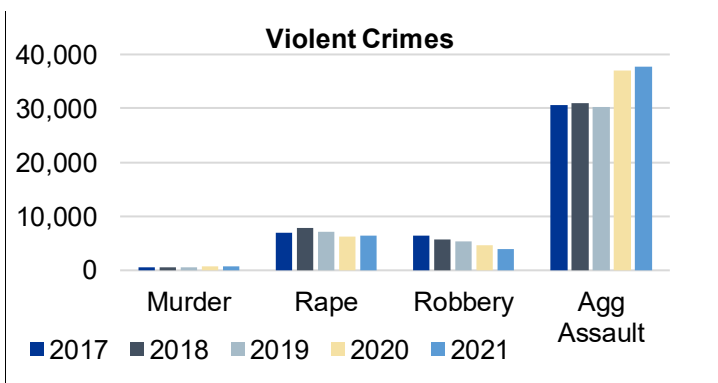
**Note:** Because the most recent FBI Crime in the United States reports do not include Arson in their calculation of property crime rates, Arson is not included as an index crime in this report.

#### 2021 Summary:

- [Violent crime](#) increased 0.3% from 2020 and increased 9.2% since 2017
  - Murder decreased from 2020, but was higher than 2017, 2018, and 2019
  - Robbery decreased steadily over the five-year period
  - Rape continued to decrease since 2018
  - Aggravated Assault continued to increase since 2019
- [Property crime](#) decreased 2.4% from 2020 and decreased 24.3% since 2017
  - Burglary and Larceny have steadily decreased in the last five-years
  - Motor Vehicle Thefts have been increasing since 2018

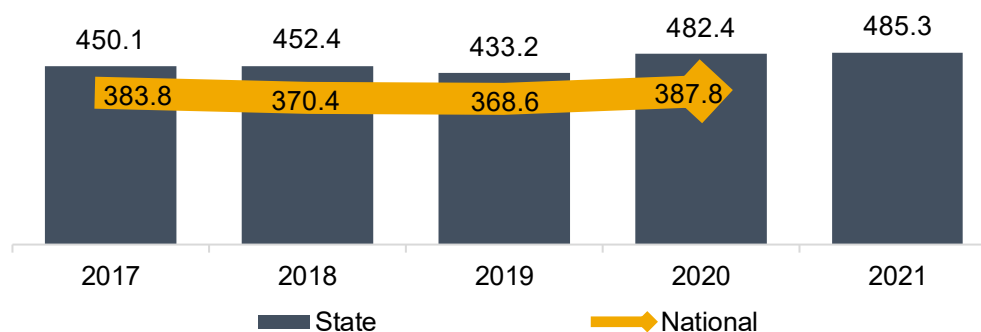

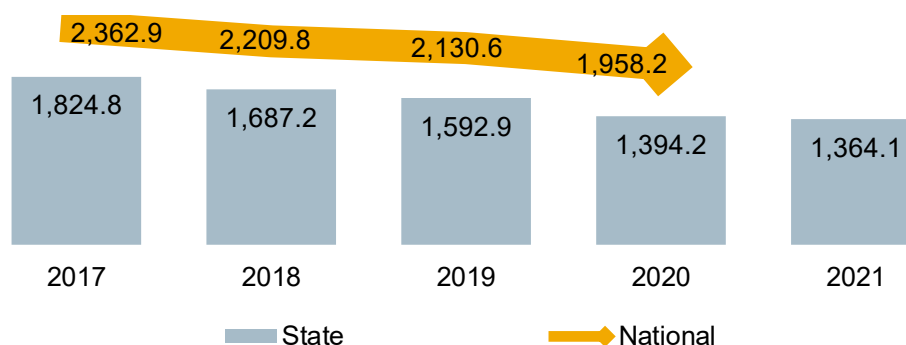

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# 2021 – Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter



**Definition:** The FBI’s UCR program has defined Murder as the willful killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, or justifiable homicide are not included in this offense category. This crime includes MICR offense file class 09001.

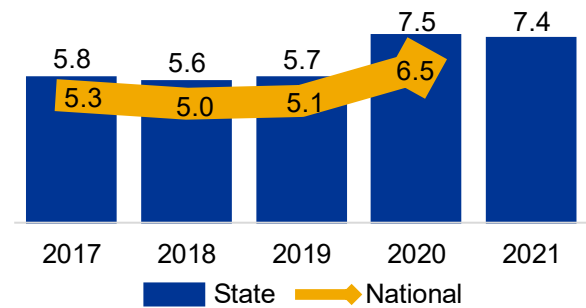

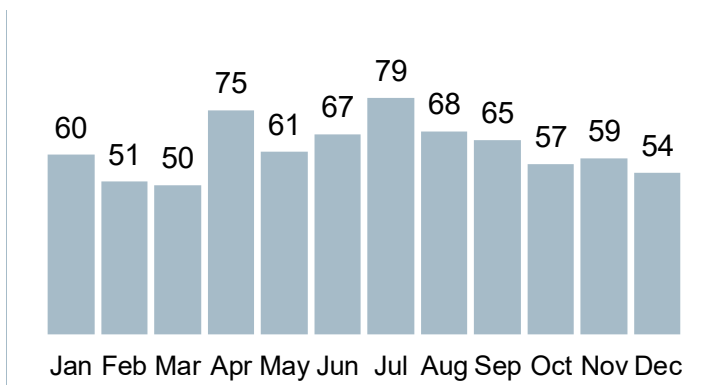

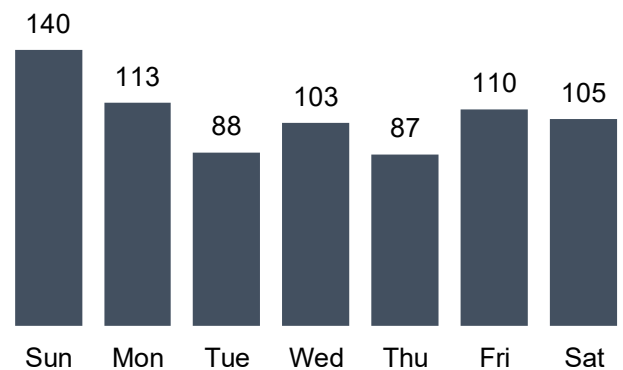
**Crime Rates**

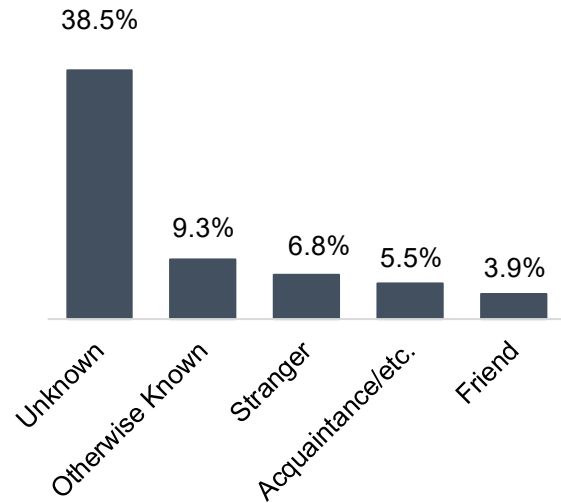

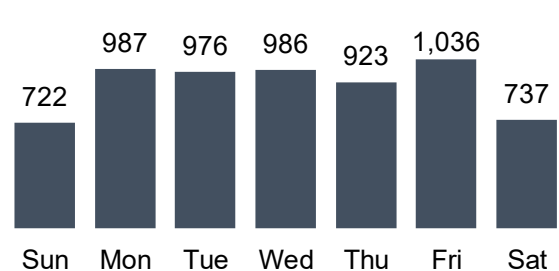

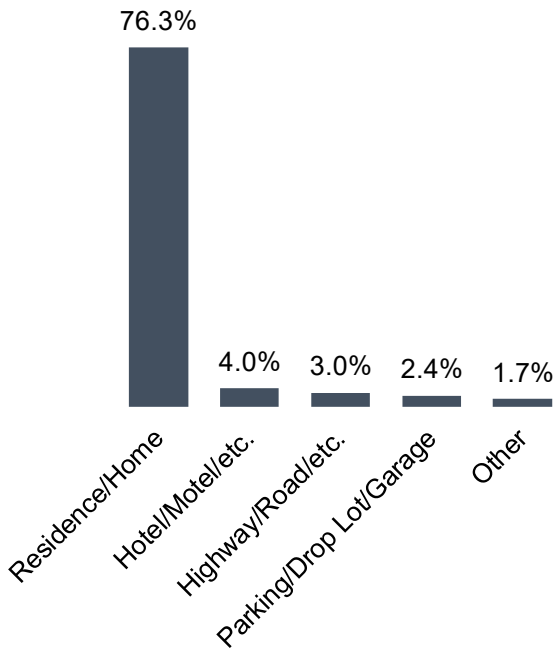

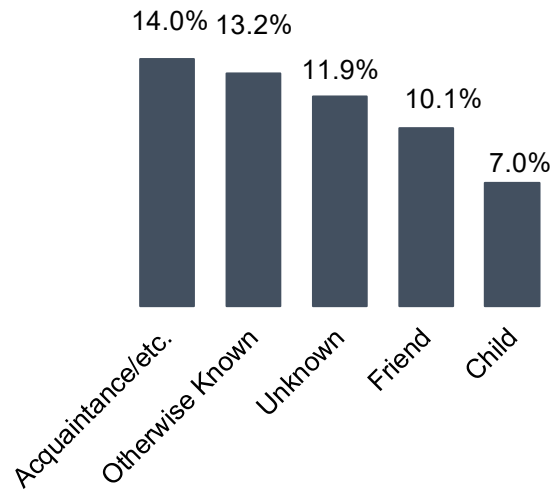

**Definition:** Robbery is the taking, or attempting to take, anything of value under confrontational circumstances from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force, threat of force, or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm. Robbery is a type of aggravated theft; the victim is directly confronted and threatened with force or is put in fear that force will be used. Because force may be involved, it is included within the violent crime calculations. This crime includes MICR offense files classes 12000 and 12001.

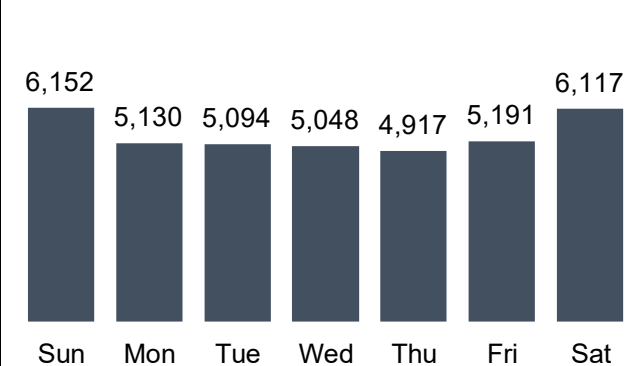

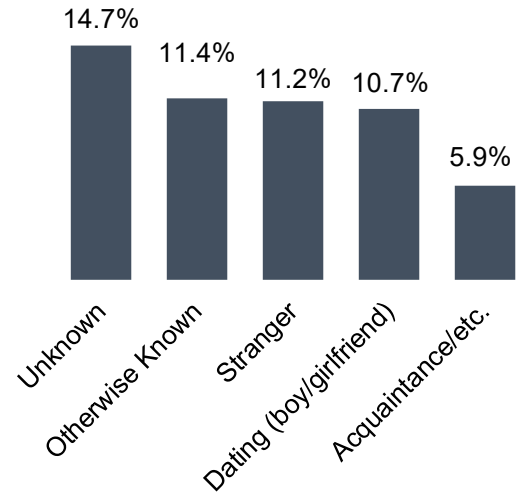

This includes MICR offense file class 24001.

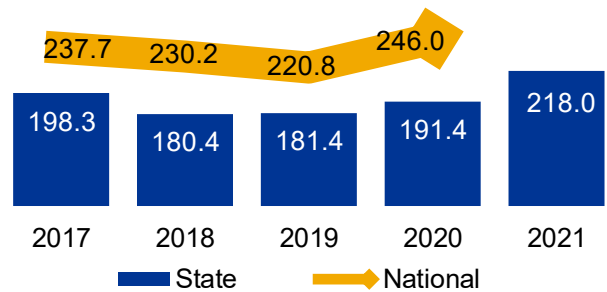

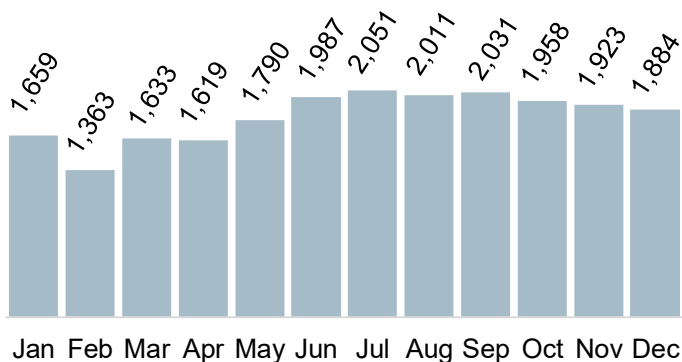

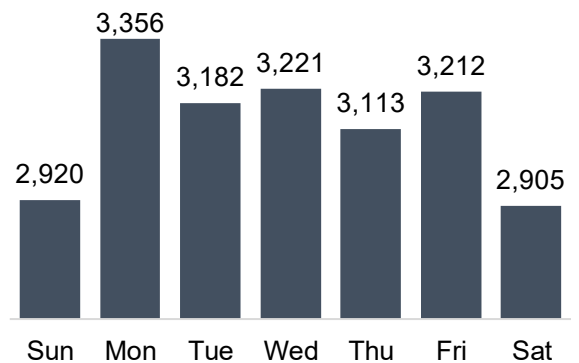
## Crime Rates

## Crimes by Day





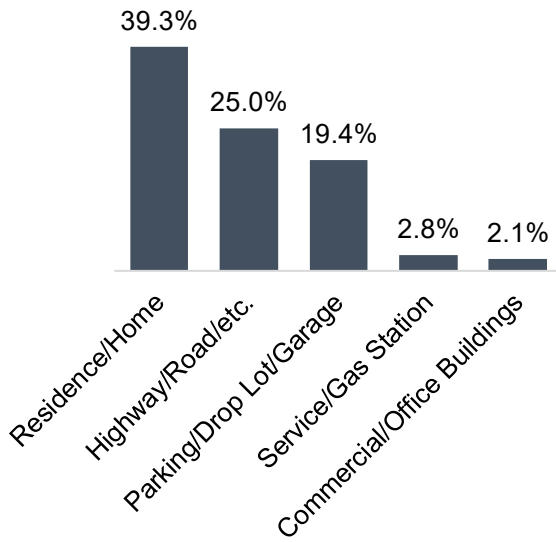

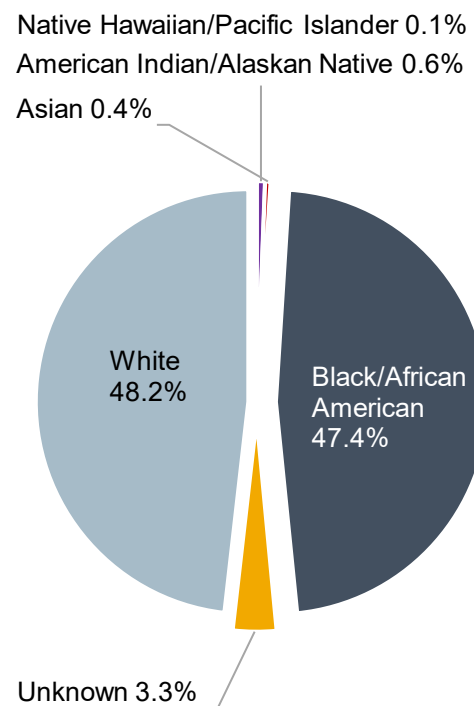

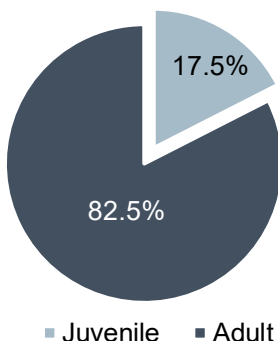

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## 2021 – Hate Bias



**Definition:** A Hate Crime is a criminal offense committed against a person or property, which is motivated in whole or in part, by the offender's bias against a race, ethnic/national origin, religion, sexual orientation, or mental/physical disability group.

### 2021 Summary:

- 610 incidents
- 769 victims; 564 were people
- Race was the highest bias category at 57.1%; Anti-Black/African American had the most counts
- Anti-Law Enforcement was the second largest category at 19.2%

**Note:** Due to the high level of “Other” entries found to have no true bias, only Anti-Law Enforcement is listed in this category due to the creation of its own bias option utilized solely after April 2021.

An incident is one or more offenses (crimes) committed by a person or group of persons acting together, at the same time and place. A victim of multiple hate crime offenses is counted for each offense. Therefore, the number of offenders can be lower than the number of victims.

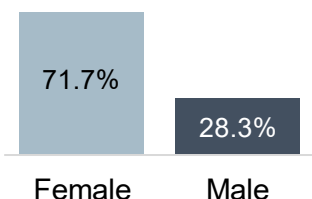

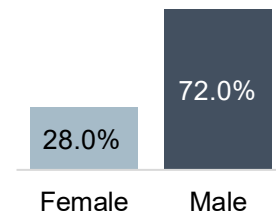

## 2021 – Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted



The Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA) collection is separate from MICR's crime data collection. Though officer assault and death information are collected thru MICR data, officer deaths are followed up through the FBI's field office for additional information not captured in MICR submissions. For inclusion in this collection, the following criteria must be met:

- Wear/carry a badge and firearm
- Duly sworn with full arrest powers
- Was acting in an official capacity (on or off duty) at the time of assault or death. If killed, the death was directly related to the injuries received during the incident

## 2021 – Secure Cities



The Michigan State Police began a Secure City initiative in 2012. Michigan's 2021 Secure Cities include: Benton Harbor, Detroit, Flint, Hamtramck, Harper Woods, Highland Park, Inkster, Lansing, Muskegon Heights, Pontiac, and Saginaw. Crime counts include incidents from all law enforcement agencies reporting crimes for that city.

### **Violent Crime compared to last year:**

- Increased for all Secure Cities except for Flint, Harper Woods, Muskegon Heights, and Pontiac
- Robbery decreased for all Secure Cities except for Benton Harbor, Harper Woods, and Inkster

### **Property Crime compared to last year:**

- Decreased for all Secure Cities except for Detroit, Hamtramck, Harper Woods, and Highland Park
- Burglary decreased for all Secure Cities except for Hamtramck and Highland Park

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## Section 6: Data Element Version Change Log

MICR implemented versioning to the schematron in April of 2019. The first version (Base) was followed by new versions, approximately every six months. Though MICR is currently only accepting the two most recent versions, during 2020, MICR was accepting all versions to allow vendor updates.
